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A.A. PREAMBLE

ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. There are no dues or fees for A.A. membership; we are self-supporting through our own contributions. A.A. is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

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Anonymity Statement

There may be some here who are not familiar with our tradition of anonymity at the public level: "Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, TV, films and new media." Thus, we respectfully ask that no A.A. Speaker-or, indeed, any A.A. Member - be identified by full name in published or broadcast reports of our meetings. The assurance of anonymity is essential in our effort to help other problem drinkers who may wish to share our recovery program with us, and our tradition of anonymity reminds us that A.A. Principles come before personalities.

The long form of A.A.'s Eleventh Tradition says, "Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed." In keeping with this principle, please do not post recognizable photos of identifiable A.A. members on web sites accessible to the public, including unrestricted pages on social networking sites. Modern communication in A.A. is flowing from one alcoholic to another in ways that are high-tech, relatively open-ended and evolving quickly. Protecting anonymity is a major concern for members, who are accessing the Internet in ever-growing numbers. When we use digital media, we are responsible for our own anonymity and we protect that of others. When we post, text, or blog, we should consider whether we are publishing at the public level. When we break our anonymity in these forums, we may inadvertently break the anonymity of others.

Accessibilities

Special seating has been reserved in all the ballrooms for those with special needs. Please contact any committee member or stop by the accessibility table in the Invemess Foyer. Assisted listening devices will be available on a first come first serve basis. In addition, a certified ASL interpreter will be signing at all speaker meetings. A wheel chair accessible shuttle is available (Dial O). Reserved handicapped parking is available adjacent to Inverness Hall; proper accessible designation is required.

Alateen Meetings

Parents/Guardians (or their designated Area-certified escort) are responsible for their children at all times during the Convention, except when they are attending an Alateen workshop.

Alateen workshop meetings will be held in Stirling Hall. Al-Anon Members involved in Alateen Service (AMAIS) who are currently certified by their Areas will serve as Alateen Group Sponsors for the closed Alateen workshops and will monitor the Alateen meeting area.

Children ages 9 to 12 may attend Alateen workshops only if their parent/guardian signs them in and out at the beginning and end of each workshop session. Each session requires a new sign-in and sign-out. Children will not be released to anyone other than the person who signed them in.

Parents/guardians (or their designated Area-certified escort) are responsible for their children before the Alateen workshops begin and after each workshop ends. The Convention's responsibility begins when a child enters the workshop room and ends at the end of the workshop. All workshop participants must vacate the rooms at the end of each workshop session.

One "OPEN" Alateen workshop will be held, which may be attended by anyone with a Convention Badge. The remaining three Alateen workshops are "CLOSED" and only registered Alateens and the Alateen Group Sponsors assigned to that workshop may attend. See the program schedule to identify the open and closed Alateen workshops.

Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMAIS) who are not assigned to an Alateen Workshop may attend the open meeting and are invited to sign up at the

Alateen registration table outside the Al-Anon/Alateen meeting room in case additional assistance is needed. "I'm Certified!" tags will be distributed at the Alateen registration table outside the Al-Anon/Alateen meeting room while supplies last.

Announcements

All announcements must be made by the Voice of the convention. Present any announcements to the convention chair for approval before presentation.


Why do I have to pay?

associations like to hold conferences conventions. In AA, however, a conference or convention is an important opportunity to share the AA experience in a broad way. There are many AA conferences held around the world. One of the most common misconceptions about these gatherings is that they are AA meetings, and since there are no dues or fees for AA membership, there should be no fees to attend. Conferences and conventions are special events, not regular meetings. They require months of planning, preparation, and money to present. Since most events are held in hotels or convention centers, there is a charge for use of the facilities. Along with this charge, the facility will require that the group purchase food and coffee. Other expenses include travel and lodging for the speakers, printing of flyers and schedules, postage, and supplies. A large event such as this requires a substantial amount of money. This convention is self-supporting. No group monies are used to pay for this event, nor do we accept outside contributions or donations of any kind. No baskets are passed. The cost of the event is paid through the registration fees. The ideal goal for any such event is to break even; therefore, the registration fee is modest compared to a weekend's worth of entertainment elsewhere. Attendance is voluntary and as responsible AA members; we pay our own way.




